Class action authorized for all persons or entities in Quebec who purchased or leased a Toyota, Honda, or Subaru Vehicle equipped with a Low-Pressure DENSO Fuel Pump with a Low-Density Impeller

1A class action has been authorized on behalf of all residents of Quebec who purchased or leased a <u>vehicle from Toyota Sales Canada, Honda Canada Inc.</u>, or <u>Subaru Canada Inc.</u>, equipped with a low-pressure fuel pump designed and <u>manufactured by DENSO equipped with a low-density impeller</u>.

The representative plaintiff alleges that Toyota, Honda and Subaru manufactured, distributed and/or sold certain Subject Vehicles to Class Members with a defective fuel pump, which was designed, manufactured and supplied by DENSO and that they failed to timely and properly initiate recalls.

The defendants deny these allegations and are contesting the class action.

The claims have not yet been proven and the Court has not yet decided whether the defendants have committed any fault, or whether any member of the class has incurred damages. However, if you are included in the class action, your rights may be impacted. If you wish to remain a class member, you do not need to take any steps at this time. If you wish to opt out, you have until August 30, 2024 to advise Cl ass Counsel (identified below) and the clerk of the Superior Court of Quebec, District of Montreal, at 1 Notre Dame Street East, Montreal, Quebec, H2Y 1B6, by registered mail.
